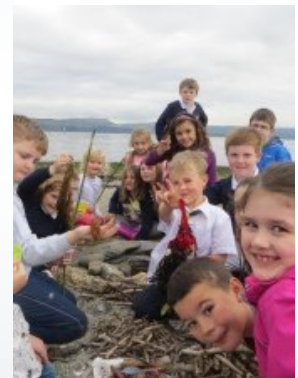

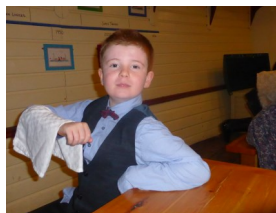


## P5 Visit To The Tall Ships
