A fantastic musical production was enjoyed by family and friends as our Infant classes and the Pre- 5 performed their Christmas Nativity.

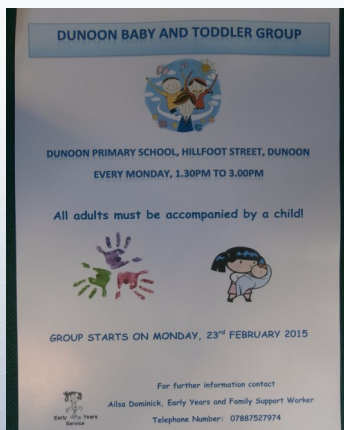


Play Sessions at Dunoon Primary

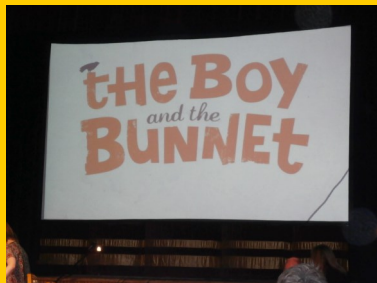
School re-opens 20th April

P7 will explore poetry using Alfred Noyes poem The Highwayman as a stimulus.
